Funding Sources

During fiscal year 2023-2024, TREC Badlands Head Start programs were the only programs for which TREC functioned as a grantee body. TREC's Board of Directors assumes legal and fiscal responsibility for oversight of TREC's programs and funding.

- TREC only receives funding from the Department of Health and Human Services to conduct its program operations through a Head Start and Early Head Start grant.
- Federal dollars are supplemented through in-kind donations from parents,
 Policy Council, Governing Board, and community members volunteering
 time in order to help TREC achieve program goals.
- TREC receives meal reimbursements from the Child and Adult Care Food Program (CACFP). TREC also budgets a portion of its federal monies for the cost of food and snacks where CACFP falls short.

Each year, TREC develops a budget that coincides with the current needs of the program. The chart below shows the 23-24 budgeted amount in each major category, as well as monies spent and how that relates to the overall budget.
